

Jeremiah becomes a prophet



Here you find the calling of Jeremiah into the service as a prophet. God encourages Jeremiah by making it clear to him: He knew Jeremiah already before his birth (vv4-5)!

When Jeremiah tries to object, God affirms His call and assures Jeremiah that He would be with him and that Jeremiah was to speak God's words (vv7-10).

Jeremiah has two visions: a branch of an almond tree (v11) and a boiling pot (v13).

The first one speaks of God watching over His word, and the other of the announced judgment over Jerusalem.

The almond tree, which starts to blossom before all the other trees, form is called "the watching one" in Hebrew. God uses it as an illustration of Himself watching over His word.
