A letter from God



God doesn't only have his message proclaimed orally. He gives it to the Jews in written form as well.

Jeremiah has to write a letter on behalf of God to those Jews who are already in Babylon in captivity. The content of the letter is as follows:

- 1. Expect to stay in Babylon for some time. Build houses and have families (vv1-6).
- 2. Pray for the city in which you live (v7). (This is also good advice for you!)
- 3. Don't listen to the false prophets (vv8-9)!
- 4. I will keep all my promises. You will in the future return again to Jerusalem (vv10-14).



- 78. Why should the Jews pray for the peace of Babylon?
- 79. When will the captivity in Babylon end, according to God's word?
- 80. What thoughts does God have concerning His people?



The Jews in Babylon were those of the first deportation into captivity (see 2 Kings 24:10-16). The final deporation of the rest of the Jews remaining in Jerusalem took place eleven years later (2 Kings 25:1-7).



You can do better than to demonstrate for peace in the world – you can pray for it!

78. If there is peace in Babylon, the Jews living in Babylon will also be able to live in peace. There is a similar instruction in the New Testament. Read 1 Timothy 2:1-2! 79. After 70 years (v10). 80. Thoughts of peace (v11). —God has only plans for good for you, even if sometimes it doesn't seem like it at first glance.
