"Just be patient!"



Christians often suffer difficulties in the world, but they know that their Lord will come soon and reward their faithfulness.

Until then, you need patience and perseverance, just like a farmer waiting for the harvest (vv7-8).

The prophets and Job provide a valuable object lesson with regard to perseverance and patience. For example, patience is necessary if others don't want to believe your words. Don't try to put greater emphasis on your words with swearing, but simply always speak the truth (v12).

Personal and corporate prayer are very important: Prayer is mentioned seven times in verses 13-18.

But there are also situations where it is needful that something is "done": If someone wanders from the truth, he should be led back (vv19-20).
